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So you think you're having a bad day? Think again. It started off like any other day for Bart, a one year-old cat from Tampa, Florida. Then, as reported by the Portland Press, he was struck by a car, presumed dead by his guardians, and buried alive. But Bart made use of every one of his nine lives. Five days after being buried alive, on January 21, a neighbor found him. Despite head trauma, a damaged eye, and a broken jaw, Bart somehow managed to dig himself out of his grave and walk to his neighbor's yard.

Despite his facial injuries, Bart did not suffer any internal injuries. He underwent <u>surgery</u> at the <u>Humane Society of Tampa Bay</u> January 28th to wire his jaw and remove his damaged eye and he is expected to make a complete recovery.

Although extreme, Bart's story is a cautionary tale of why cats should be kept indoors. Experts agree indoor-only cats outlive their outdoor counterparts. Besides cars, outdoor cats are threatened by coyotes, dogs, becoming lost, deadly viruses such as feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV), feline leukemia virus (FELV), feline infectious peritonitis (FIP), and, on rare occasions, rabies.
